Youth Justice Center State E-Tournament Rules

GRADE DIVISION

One virtual State E-Tournament will be held on the same day for two grade divisions. One grade division is middle school for 6th-8th grade and the other grade division is high school for 9th-12th grade. Youth in your care do not need to be currently enrolled in a public/private school to participate but they should enter the division that is appropriate for their age.

YOUTH

Youth compete individually and centers may have multiple individuals compete. Each individual must have an individual iCivics.org student username. To register as a student on iCivics.org, each juvenile will need an email address. Temporary Gmail accounts can be created to fulfill this requirement or staff emails may be utilized.

REGISTRATION

The State E-Tournament will be held virtually and does not require travel. The teacher/officer will need to pre-register their youth by completing the following steps:

- **Step 1:** Register each participating juvenile on iCivics.org as a **STUDENT**. You will need to use the class code - **Rutledge90246**
 - **IMPORTANT:** Place the teacher/officer's first and last name in the "First Name" box and the center name in the "Last Name" box.
- **Step 2:** Create a username/password on www.LawForKids.org if you are not already registered.
- **Step 3:** Log onto lawforkids.org/az-youth-justice-centers to register your youth for the virtual State E-Tournament. You must include the student usernames that iCivics.org assigned. This is how youth will be identified and winners will be determined.
- **Step 4:** Receive an email within 5 business days from the Arizona Bar Foundation confirming registration. Please check you spam mailbox if the email is not received within 5 business days.

COMPETING

The State E-Tournament rules are as follows:

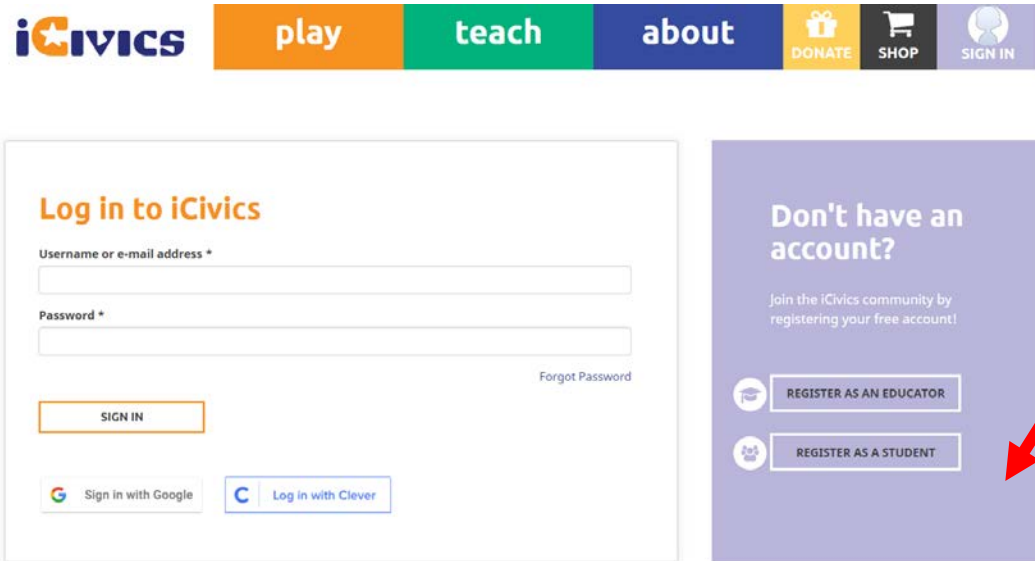
- Youth must log onto www.iCivics.org with their assigned iCivics student username and go to the Arizona Youth Justice Center State E-Tournament classroom to access the assigned game.
- Youth may play on a computer, laptop, or iPad.
 - The assigned game is downloadable from the app store on an iPad.
- Playing through the State E-Tournament classroom on iCivics.org is the only way to submit youth results. Do NOT go directly to “Play” to access the assigned game.
- Only one submittal per individual will be accepted. In the event that a second submittal occurs, the first submittal results will be the official submittal; no exceptions.
- The teacher/officer can ensure that youth are playing in the correct iCivics “classroom” and playing the correct game but CANNOT coach youth during the actual game play.
 - The teacher/officer cannot provide any answers or direct youth to the correct answers, but they can help define vocabulary words.
- Youth can play the assigned game on the day of the State E-Tournament at any time from 12:00 am until 11:59 pm.
- Scoring is based on the highest number of impact points an individual earns while playing the game. In the event of a tie, the fastest game play time will be the deciding factor.
- The winner from both grade divisions will be announced within 2 business days.
 - Each winner will win a personal iPad!

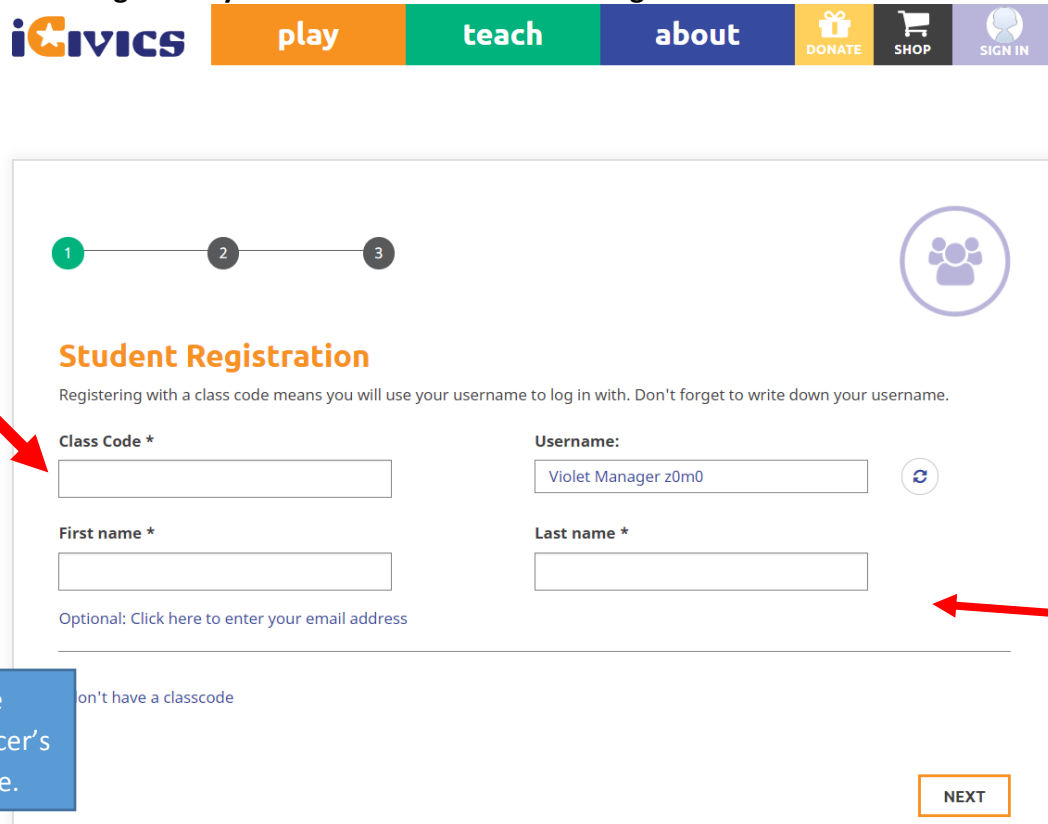

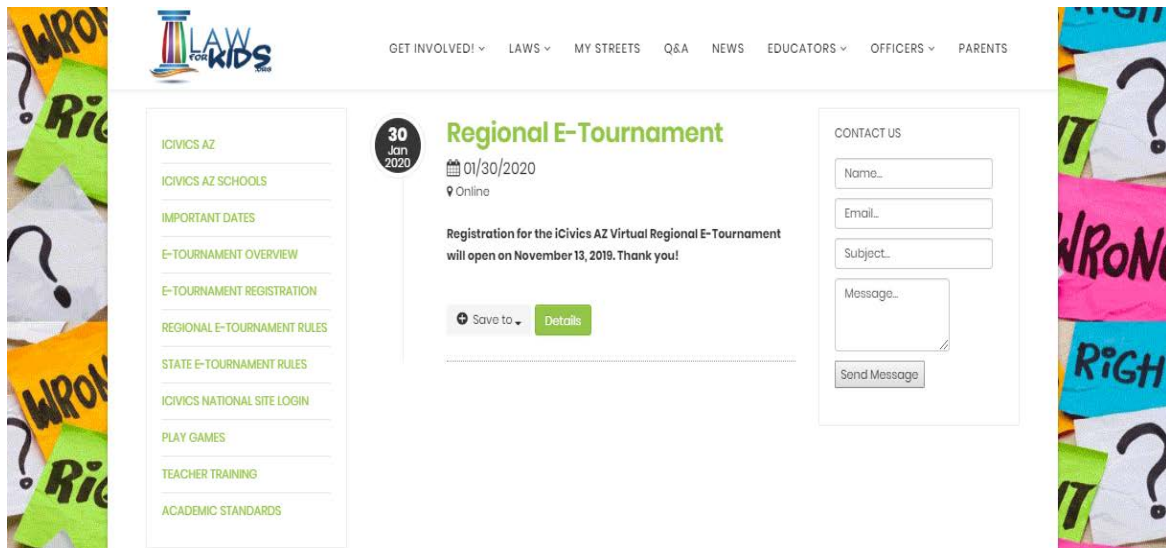
