Regional E-Tournament Rules

By participating in the virtual Regional E-Tournament, teams will compete to qualify for the virtual State E-Tournament. The top 8 teams from the Regional E-Tournament will be invited to State.

GRADE DIVISIONS

Two virtual Regional E-Tournaments will be held on the same day for two grade divisions. One grade division is middle school for 6-8 grade students and the other is high school for 9-12 grade students.

TEAMS

Each team will be comprised of 3 students. Team members for the middle school competition must be in grades 6-8. Team members for the high school competition must be in grades 9-12.

Schools may have multiple teams compete as long as each team does not exceed 3 members. If all but 2 or less students in the class are able to form a team, 2 member teams will be accepted. Each team must have an individual team name using the iCivics username generator.

REGISTRATION

The Regional E-Tournament will be held virtually and does not require travel. The team's coach will need to pre-register their team by completing the following steps:

- **Step 1:** Register your team on icivics.org as a **STUDENT**. Only one student registration is needed per team. **You will need to use the class code - Taney3533** **IMPORTANT:** Place the teacher/coach's first and last name in the "First Name" box and the school name in the "Last Name" box.
- **Step 2:** Create a username/password on www.LawForKids.org if you are not already registered.
- **Step 3:** Log onto <https://lawforkids.org/icivics/az-etournament> to register your team in the Regional E-Tournament. You must include the username that iCivics.org assigned. This is how your username from iCivics will be tracked to your team to determine the State E-Tournament qualifying teams.
- **Step 4:** Receive an email within 5 business days from the Arizona Bar Foundation confirming registration. Please check junk/spam mailboxes if the email is not received within 5 business days.

COMPETING

All teams must compete in the virtual Regional E-Tournament to qualify for the State E-Tournament. The top 8 teams in both grade divisions will be invited. The Regional E-Tournament rules are as follows:

- Teams may compete from their own practice site. Travel is not required as this is a virtual e-tournament.
- The coach must log their team(s) onto www.iCivics.org with their team's assigned student login information and go to the iCivics Arizona Regional E-Tournament classroom to access the assigned game.
- Playing through the iCivics Arizona Regional E-Tournament classroom on iCivics.org is the only way to submit team results. Do NOT go to "Play" to access the assigned game.
- All members of a team may work together to play the assigned game on www.iCivics.org.
- Only one submittal per team. Do NOT have each team member play the game separately.
- The coach can ensure the team is playing in the correct iCivics "classroom" and game but CANNOT coach their team during the actual game play. The coach cannot provide any answers or direct the team members to the correct answers.
- The team can play the assigned game on the day of the Regional E-Tournament at any time. The game time opens at 12:00am and closes at 11:59pm. However, only one submittal will be accepted. In the event that a second submittal occurs, the first submittal results will be the official submittal; no exceptions.
- The top 8 teams in both grade divisions will be announced within 2 business days following completion of the Regional E-Tournament.

TOP 8 TEAMS

The top 8 teams will be invited to the virtual State E-Tournament to compete in the state championship. The State E-Tournament will not require travel. Only the 3 team members and their coach will be permitted to attend the State E-Tournament. Please see the "State E-Tournament Rules" for more information.

All Regional E-Tournament teams that do not qualify in the top 8 will receive a certificate of participation. The top 8 teams will receive a certificate announcing their team placement in the Regional E-Tournament.

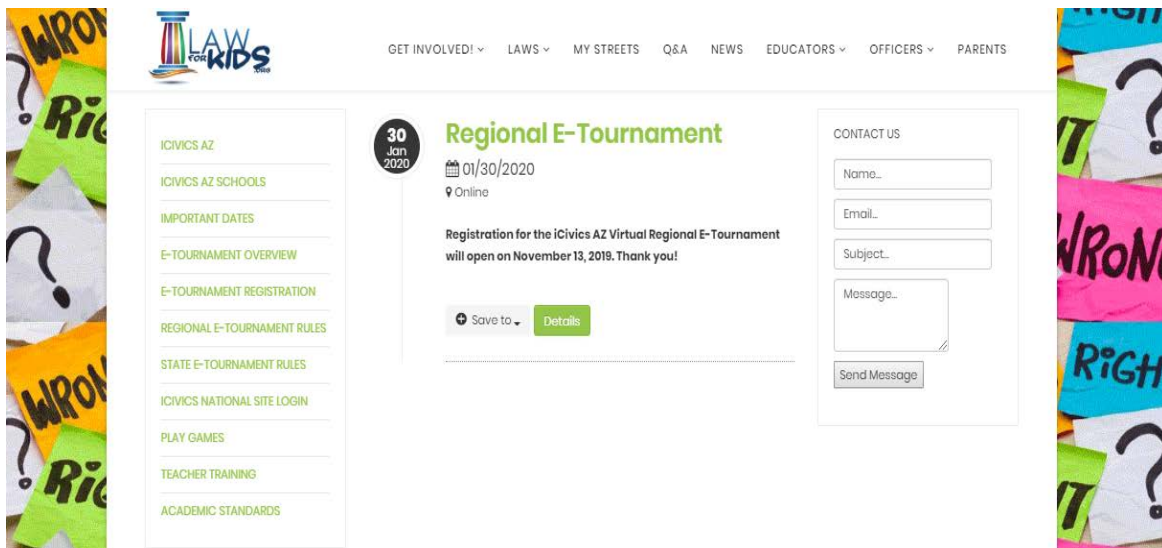
