

- 8 Watch the Governor's Inauguration Speech.





The **Governor** of Arizona has a difficult job and has to make important decisions. Some of these responsibilities include meeting with city leaders, keeping the state safe, and deciding what state laws to approve or **veto**. Veto means to reject or not approve something.


WHAT IT TAKES TO BE GOVERNOR

- Be a citizen of the United States for at least 10 years;
- Be a qualified voter in Arizona;
- Be 25 years or older; and
- Have lived in Arizona for at least 5 years.


If not, tell them to register today! Then, ask your family to take you with them the next time they go to vote.
