HOW A BILL BECOMES A LAW

If a bill (proposal for a law), is liked by everyone, it can be approved in just 7 steps. If a bill is not agreed upon by everyone, it can go back and forth between the Senate and House of Representatives, never be put up for a vote, vetoed (denied) by the Governor, and even filibustered (delayed by a legislator who talks so long that others don't get to vote).



Number the steps in order of how a bill becomes a law.

A bill can start in either the House of Representatives (House) or the Senate. For this activity, the bill starts in the House.

A) If it's approved, the House sends the bill to the Senate where they can approve the bill they were given or make their own changes. If they make changes to the bill, it goes back to the House for their approval after they are done. ____

B) The bill becomes a law. ____

C) The bill is given to a House committee for them to read, study, and revise. Once they are done, they make a recommendation to pass the bill, report about the bill to the rest of the House, or table the bill (put the bill on hold until later). ____

D) A bill is written and introduced to the House to see what they think. This is when the bill is given a number. ____

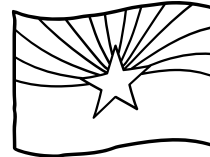
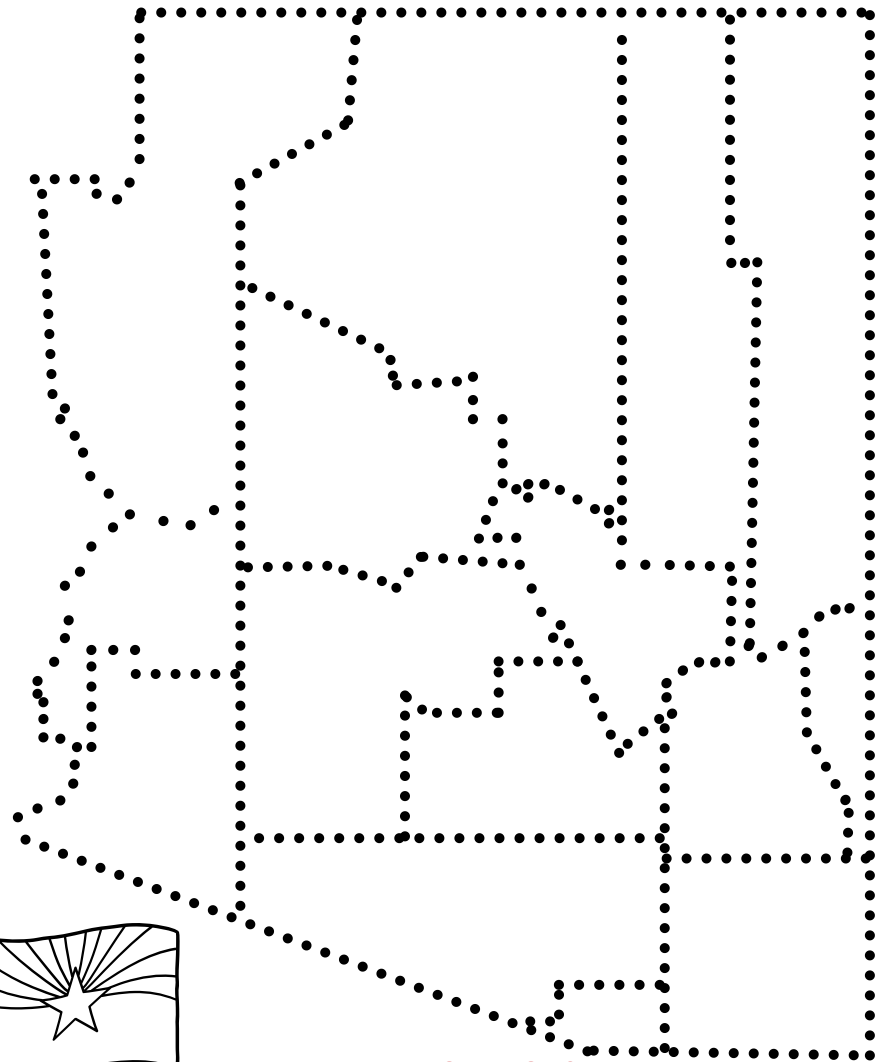
E) The House votes on the updated bill. ____

F) If the bill makes it out of committee, it is sent to the House for debate and changes. ____

G) The bill is sent to the Governor for their signature or veto. ____

Find a map of Arizona and label each county on the map below!



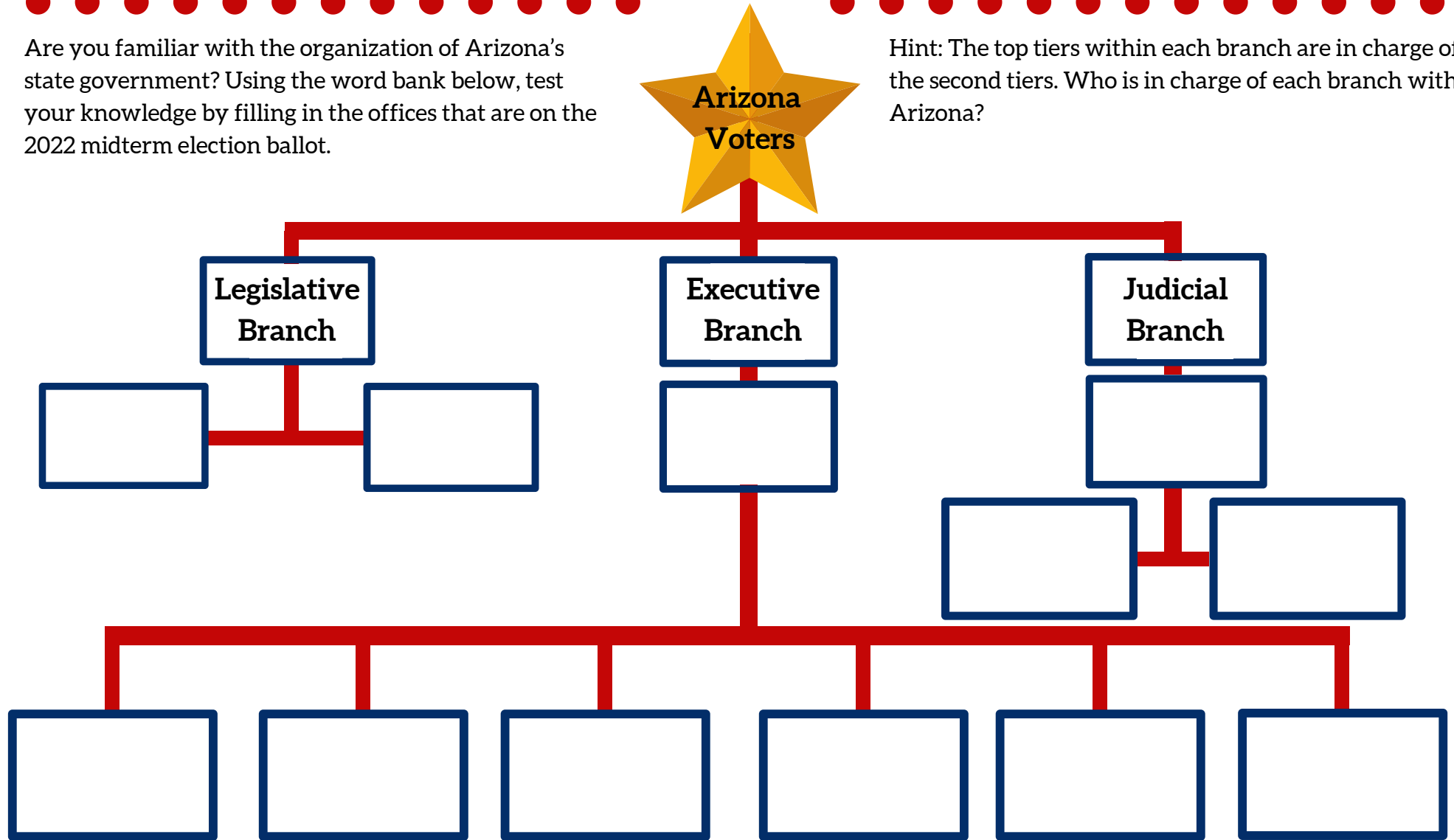
DID YOU KNOW?
