The legal amount of alcohol a person (21 and older) can have in their blood stream before getting arrested in Arizona according to ARS 28-1381 is below .08, unless impairment is proved.

Blood Alcohol Concentration which may be measured by a blood test, breath test or urine sample. Refusal to take the test may result in a one-year suspension of your drivers license.

Arizona is a no tolerance state which means a person under 21 may be arrested for DUI with any amount of blood alcohol concentration. Impairment does not need to be proven.

Yes, in accordance with Arizona Revised Statute 28-1381A3, a person who shows impairment. Other crimes may have been committed in accordance with possession of drugs whether marijuana, dangerous drugs or narcotic drugs.

Yes, in accordance with Arizona Revised Statute 28-1381A3, a person who shows impairment while taking a prescription medication may be arrested for DUI. If a person is in possession of a prescription that is not theirs at the time of their arrest, they may also be charged with possession of a prescription drug that does not belong to them.

Traffic violations, Aggravated DUI (passenger under 15 in the vehicle at the time of the violation), Aggravated Assault, Manslaughter, Driving without a license; Driving in violation of a permit, Driving with a Suspended Driver's License.
