Jury Duty Scenarios Handout

1. Jason is 18 years old and a senior in high school. He recently received his first jury summons. The summons has requested that he comes for jury selection on Friday which is the same day as his senior prom. He would like to skip the jury selection so he can attend prom. Is this a valid reason and who would you call or email?
2. Serena is 20 years old and in her final year of high school. She has been in special education classes for the past three years due to a traumatic brain injury she received in a car accident. The brain injury has left her without hearing and with mild cognitive disability. Serena has been summoned to serve on a jury. Is she eligible?
3. Julio is 15 years old and has the same exact name as his father. Their mail often gets mixed up. Julio received a jury summons with his name and date of birth on the materials. Is he able to serve on a jury?
4. Levi has very strong religious beliefs and is 19 years old. He has received a jury summons and decided it conflicts with his religion. He would like to be excused. Can he be excused due to religious beliefs?
