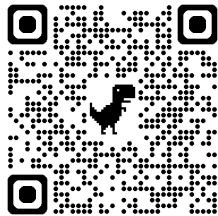


In grades K-12? Scan the QR code and use the voter I.D. to vote in the KVAZ General Election! The ballot is open September 10th through election day.

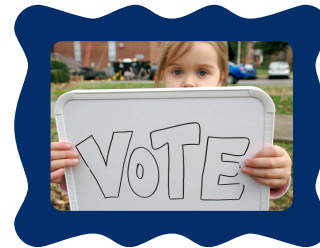
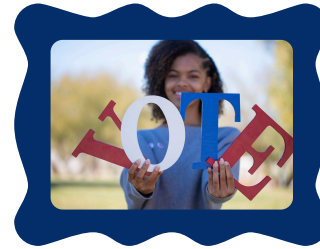

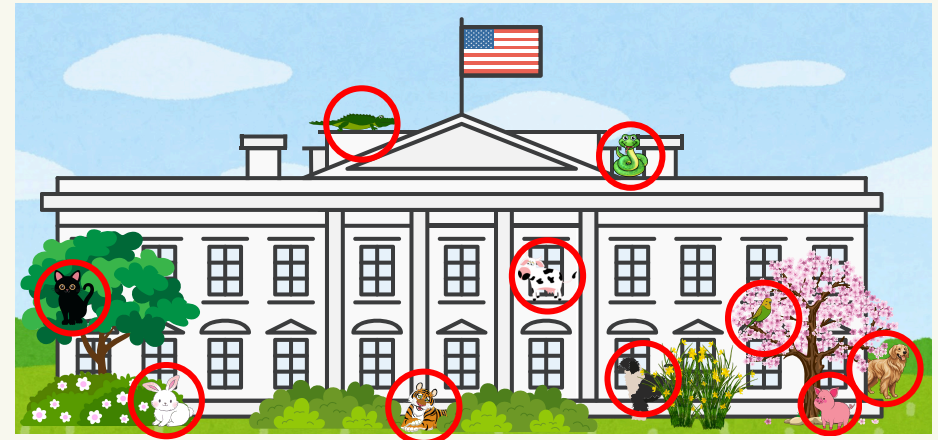

KEEP TALKING

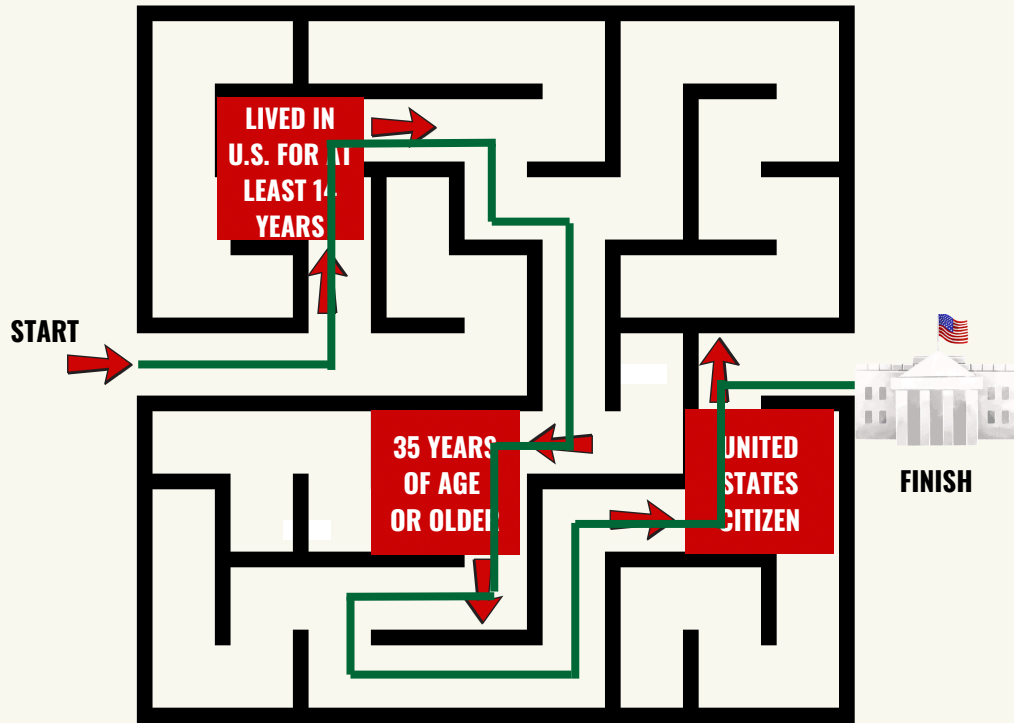

- Be 35 years or older; and
- Have lived in the United States for at least 14 years.

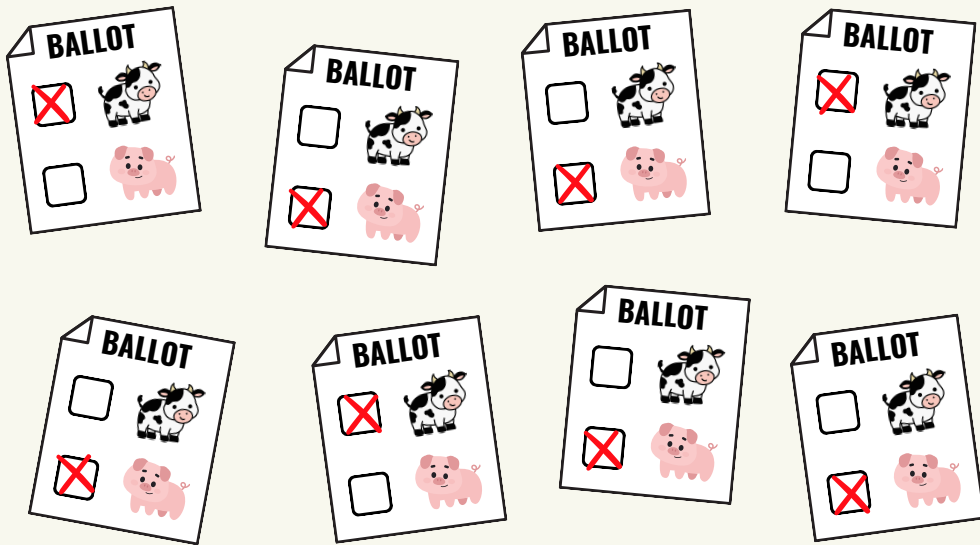

The penny shows Abraham Lincoln, our 16th President, and is worth 1 cent.
