ADDITIONAL ACTIVITIES TO DO WITH YOUR FAMILY!

- 1 Sign up for a library card at your local library. You can check out books about Arizona and learn about the role elections have played in shaping history.
- 2 Watch the debates as a family and talk with your families about both sides of the issues.
- 3 Volunteer for a campaign and be a poll worker if you meet the age requirements.
- 4 Contact a candidate if you have questions by writing them a letter.
- 5 Ask a family member to take you to the polls when they vote. If they vote by mail, sit with them while they vote.
- 6 Watch the live election results on the day of the election and color in a map of Arizona to keep track of the county votes.
- 7 Celebrate election day with some red, white, and blue snacks!
- 8 Watch live updates and/or the Governor's State of the State address.

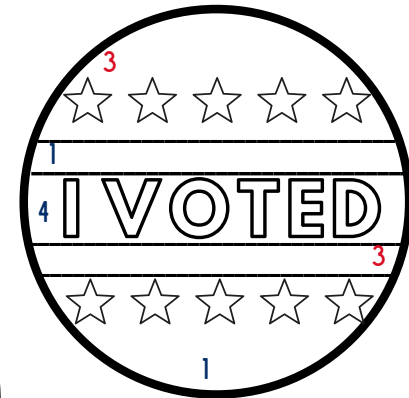
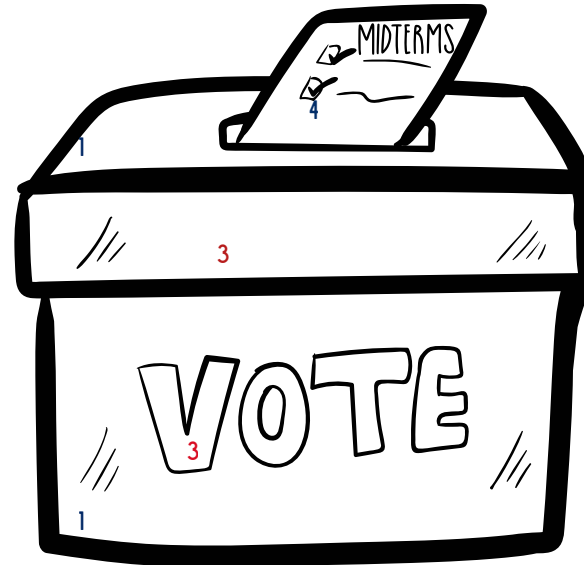

WHY MIDTERMS MATTER

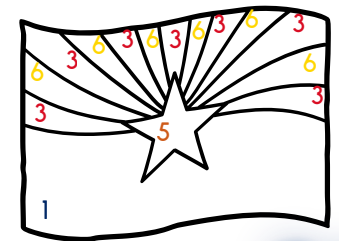
Midterm elections take place halfway through a president's term. They are important because people vote for their representatives in Congress. The political party that controls Congress (the House of Representatives and the Senate) has a strong influence on the laws and issues that are prioritized. Midterm elections also give people a chance to share their opinions on state and local laws. Color by number the voting box, the Arizona flag, and the "I Voted" sticker.

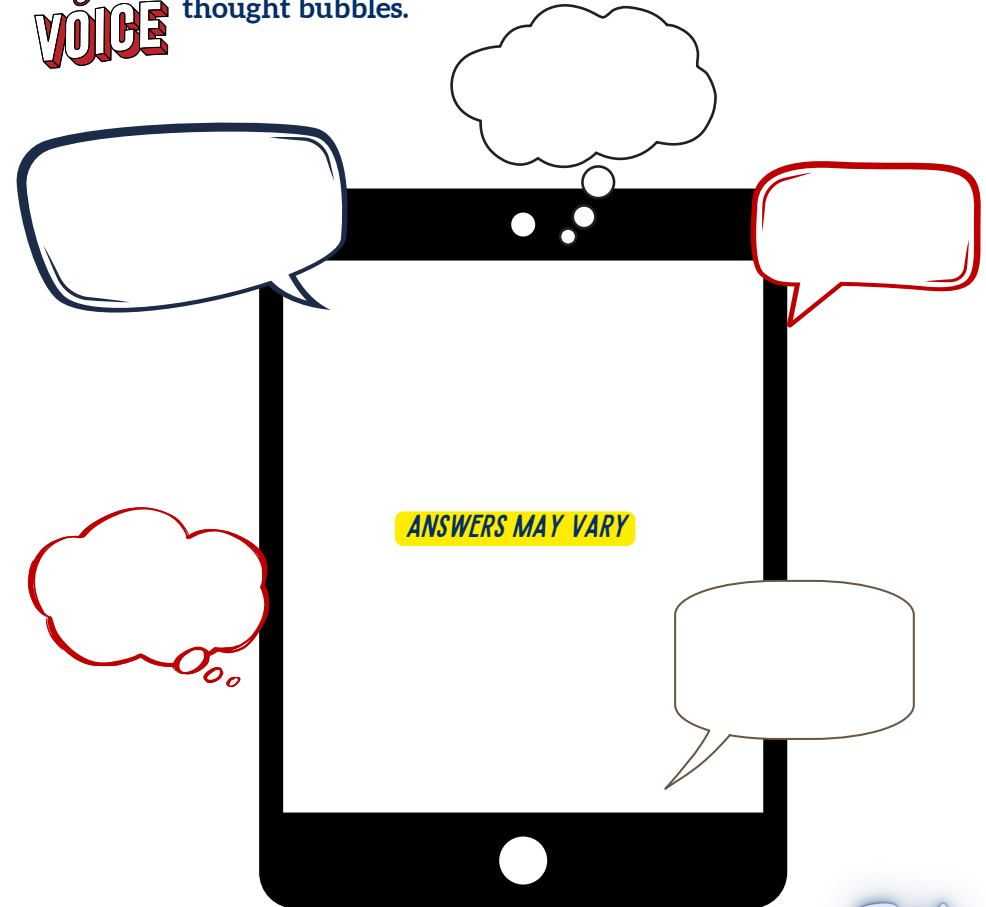

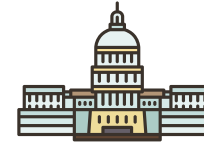
