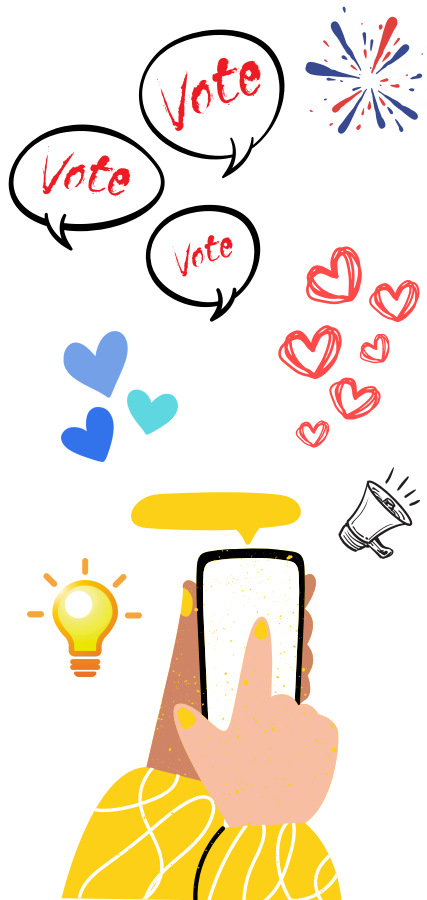
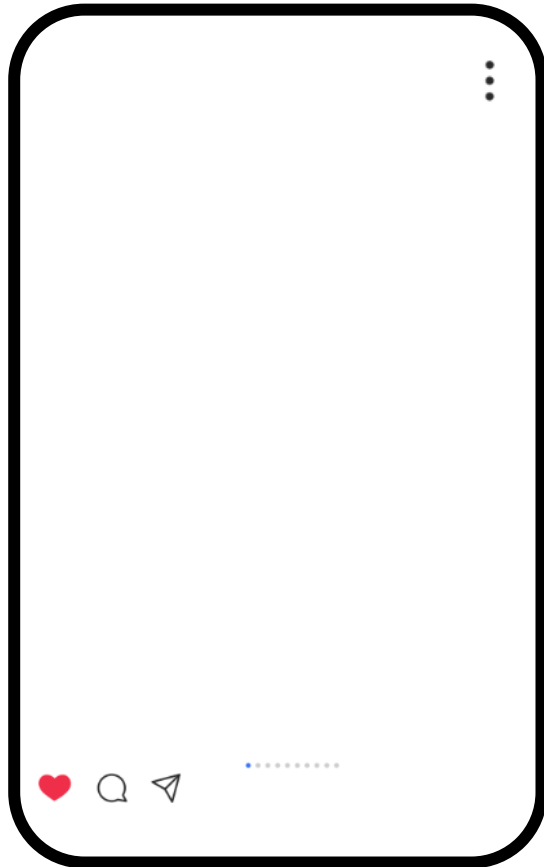

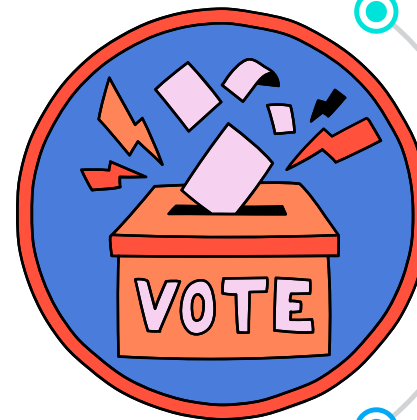

# KEEP THE CONVERSATION GOING!



Here are some additional activities to do with your family!

- 1 Sign up for a library card at your local library. You can check out books about Arizona and learn about the role elections have played in shaping history.
- 2 Watch the debates as a family and talk with your families about both sides of the issues.
- 3 Volunteer for a campaign and be a poll worker if you meet the age requirements.
- 4 Contact a candidate if you have questions by writing them a letter.
- 5 Ask a family member to take you to the polls when they vote. If they vote by mail, sit with them while they vote.
- 6 Watch the live election results on the day of the election and color in a map of Arizona to keep track of the county votes.
- 7 Celebrate election day with some red, white, and blue snacks!
- 8 Watch live updates and/or the Governor's State of the State address.

# LOCAL AND STATE MIDTERM ELECTIONS

In Arizona, midterm elections are like a sports draft. Voters get to pick the leaders (candidates) who will take on key roles in the state, like Governor, State Senators, and State Representatives. Just like a team chooses the best players for each position, voters decide who is best suited to make decisions and create laws that affect everyone in Arizona.

Arizona has three branches of government: the **Executive Branch** (headed by the Governor), the **Legislative Branch** (the State Legislature—Senate and House of Representatives), and the **Judicial Branch** (the state court system). All three branches work together to help keep the government balanced.

# ARIZONA STATE LEGISLATURE



During the midterm elections, voters choose representatives and senators, and whichever party wins the most seats gets to pick some important leadership positions! **Draw a line to match each Arizona legislative leadership position with its correct description.**

House Majority Leader

Top official in the Arizona House of Representatives.

Senate Majority Leader

Helps guide the majority party's plans and speaks for them in the House.

Speaker of the House

Top official in the Arizona Senate.

President of the Senate

Guides the majority party's agenda and speaks for them in the Senate.

## HOW A BILL BECOMES A LAW










If a bill in Arizona's legislature is popular, it can sail through in just 7 steps. BUT if people don't all agree, get ready for a rollercoaster! It might bounce between the House and Senate, get a veto from the Governor, or face a LOT of debate before it finally becomes law.

### Number the steps in order of how a bill becomes a law.

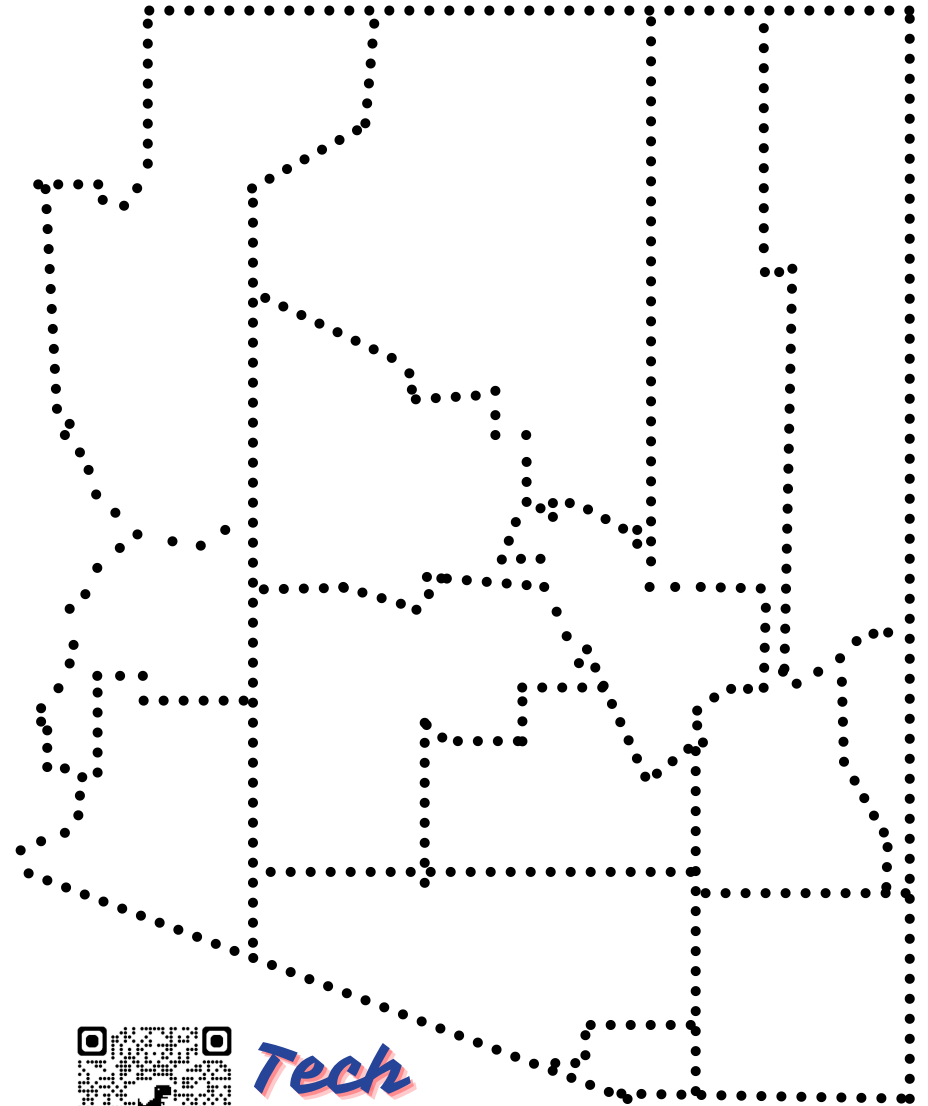
*Note: A bill can start in either the House of Representatives (House) or the Senate. For this activity, the bill starts in the House.*

#### STEP #

-  If it's approved, the House sends the bill to the Senate where they can approve the bill they were given or make their own changes. If they make changes to the bill, it goes back to the House for their approval after they are done.
-  The bill becomes a law.
-  The bill is given to a House committee for them to read, study, and revise. Next, they make a recommendation to pass the bill, report about the bill to the rest of the House, or table the bill (put the bill on hold until later).
-  A bill is written and introduced to the House to see what they think. This is when the bill is given a number.
-  The House votes on the updated bill.
-  If the bill makes it out of committee, it is sent to the House for debate and changes.
-  The bill is sent to the Governor for their signature or veto.

# WHAT IS A MIDTERM ELECTION?

Midterm elections are U.S. elections that happen \_\_\_\_\_ through a president's four-year term. They give voters a chance to choose who will \_\_\_\_\_ them in government even though the presidency is NOT on the ballot that year. In midterms, all members of the United States \_\_\_\_\_ of Representatives and about one-third of the U.S. \_\_\_\_\_ seats are up for election, which helps decide which political party controls Congress and makes laws. Midterms also often include state and local races, such as elections for the Arizona \_\_\_\_\_ or statewide positions like state representatives and senators in Arizona's \_\_\_\_\_ legislative districts. These elections matter because the people elected will help make decisions about \_\_\_\_\_, budgets, and policies that affect everyday life in Arizona and the nation.
