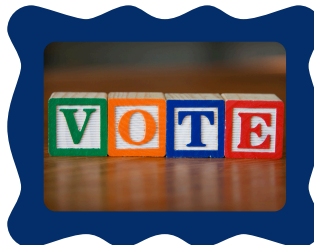
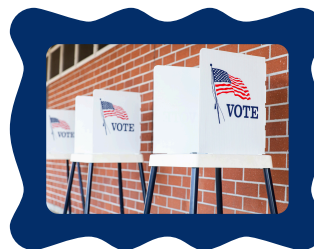

- 8 Watch the Governor's Inauguration Speech.



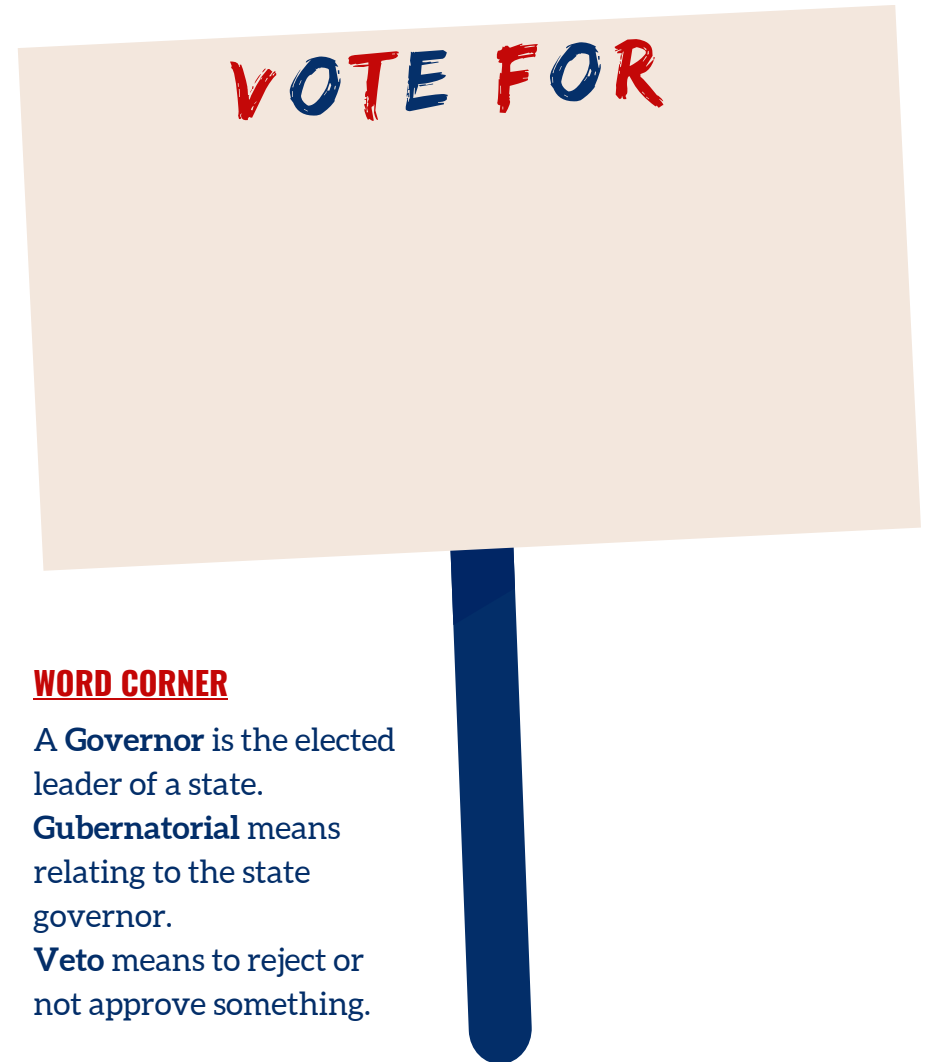

Veto means to reject or not approve something.

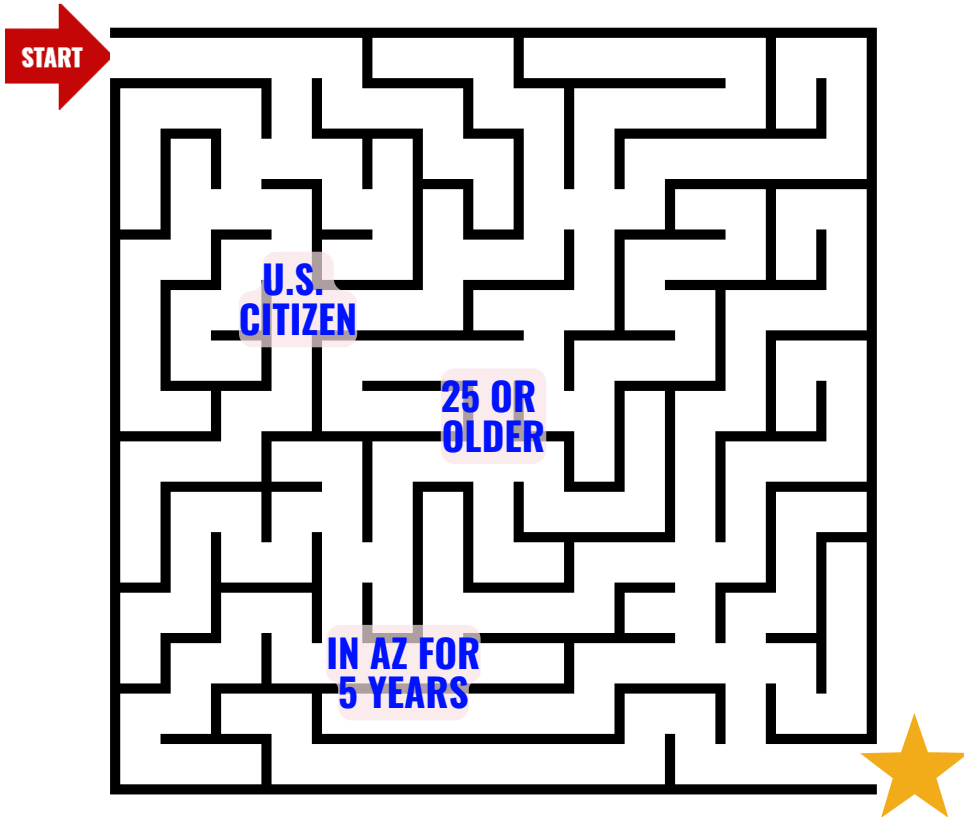
WHAT IT TAKES TO BE GOVERNOR

- Have lived in Arizona for at least 5 years.

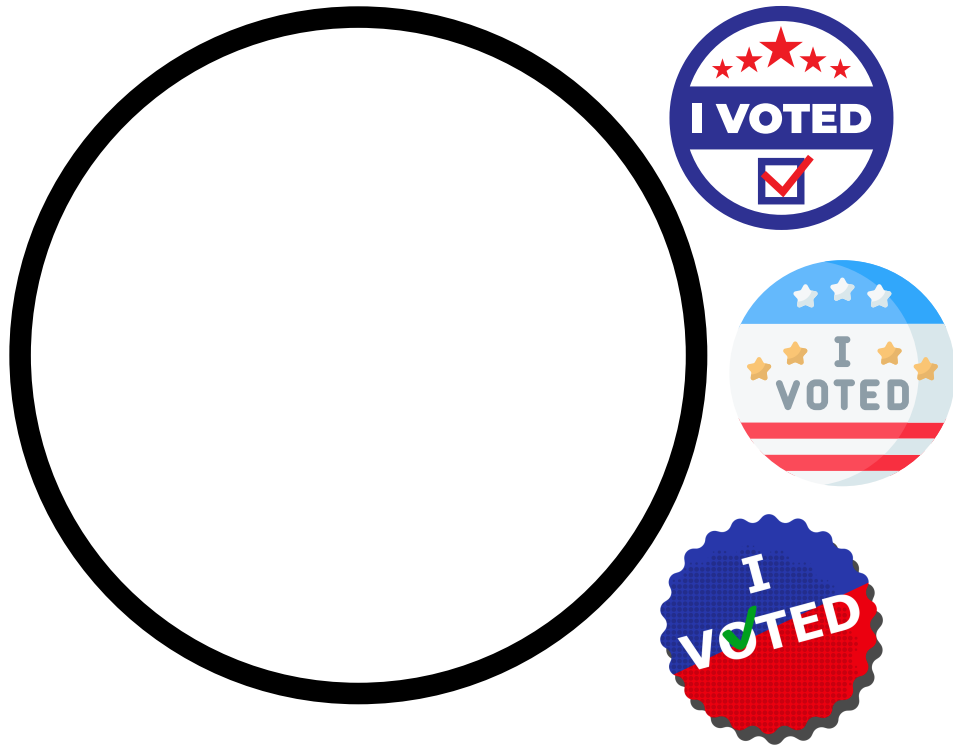

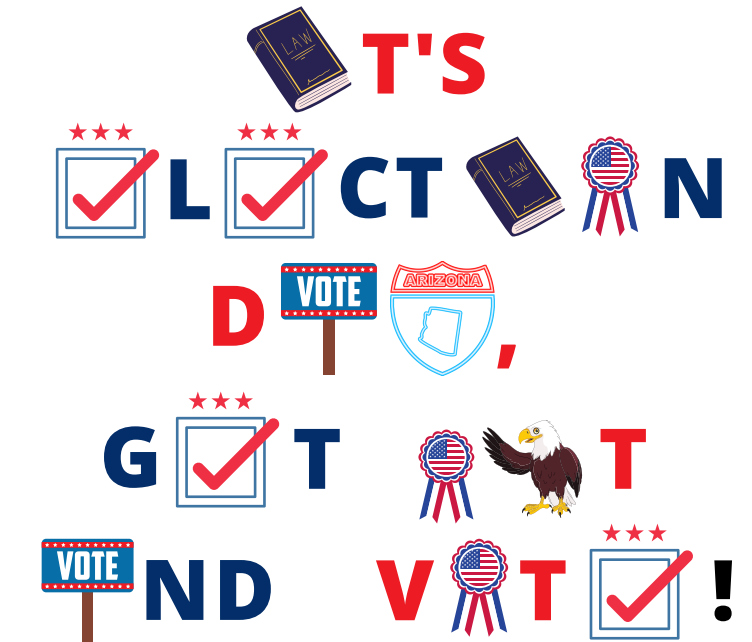
